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116 Students from 14 Colleges Participate in 12th Annual Northeast Regional Dairy Challenge®

Harrisburg, PA, November 19, 2014 – Delaware Valley College hosted a successful Northeast Regional Dairy Challenge that drew 116 students from 12 northeast colleges and two Canadian universities to Harrisburg, Pa., November 13-15, 2014. This event marked the 12th annual Northeast Regional Dairy Challenge which is an innovative, three-day educational competition designed to prepare students for careers in the dairy industry.

Working in mixed-university teams of five students, contestants assessed all aspects of a working dairy farm, including facilities, nutrition, financials, reproduction, animal health and much more. Students collaborated on a 20-minute team presentation that detailed their observations and suggestions to a panel of judges and participating farm families. Teams were ranked based on how well their evaluations matched the judges' assessment of the dairy operation.

The objective of Dairy Challenge is to create a real-life situation that stresses the importance of teamwork and professionalism. Industry chair Suzanne Demeester of Novus International, Inc. explained, "Not only does the Dairy Challenge teach technical knowledge, it excels in helping students develop people skills."

Farms evaluated at the 2014 competition included Hess Dairy Farm, Inc. in Mt. Joy, Pa.; Brook-Corner Holsteins in Lebanon, Pa.; and Furnace Hill Holsteins also in Lebanon, Pa. All teams also participated in educational workshops at Brubaker Farms in Mt. Joy and attended an industry career fair. Teambuilding and fun activities were held throughout the weekend to encourage networking among students and dairy industry sponsors.

First place teams, which were named after top sponsors of the Northeast Regional Dairy Challenge, included: Cargill, Inc., Cows Come First and Holtz-Nelson Dairy Consultants, LLC.
