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University of Florida Hosts 12th Annual Southern Regional Dairy Challenge

Over 70 students from 16 universities participated in the Southern Regional Dairy Challenge held November 12-14 in Live Oak, Florida. Hosted by the University of Florida, students joined together to enhance their farm evaluation skills to prepare them for a future career in the dairy industry.

Kicking off the two day contest, students visited Full Circle Dairy in Lee, for a general overview of the dairy and items they may want to look for at the contest dairy. Later that evening, they had brief trainings on PC-Dart, Dairy Comp 305, and financial indicators. Students were divided into teams and were able to review data from the contest herd to prepare them for the on farm evaluation the following day. Mentors from all aspects of the dairy industry were present as well to help guide the students when mining the data and for the on farm evaluation.

On Monday, teams started bright and early at the contest herd, White Oak Dairy in Mayo. Students had two hours to observe and evaluate all aspects of the dairy while taking notes and photos needed for their presentation to the judges. Following the on farm evaluation, students developed a twenty minute team presentation that includes their recommendations for the dairy on reproduction, nutrition, milking procedures, cow comfort, animal health, and financial indicators. These presentation were given the next day to a panel of industry judges.

The judges awarded the following teams with first and second place:

Division A
