# Dairy Students compete in 4<sup>th</sup> Western Regional Dairy Challenge contest in Visalia, CA

Forty-two students from six universities competed in the western regional Dairy Challenge contest, February 27 and 28, 2009 at the Holiday Inn in Visalia, Calif. Participating students represented California Polytechnic State University, California State University—Fresno, University of Idaho, South Dakota State University, Texas A&M University and Washington State University.

Students were assigned to one of the 10 "aggregate" teams to observe the operation of Mineral King Dairy and ask questions of Neil Zwart. During the farm visit on February 27, teams analyzed the entire operation including the milking area, cow performance records and feeding protocols, along with other management practices. On Saturday morning, February 28, they presented their team analysis to an expert panel of industry judges, discussing the strengths of the operation and identifying opportunities for improvement.

Team Coronado was the Platinum-ranking team, composed of students Matt Strickland from Fresno State University, Samantha Wahls from South Dakota State University, Shane Smith from the University of Idaho, and Luke de Jong Cal Poly State University.

After the contest, Dr. Stan Henderson of the Cal Poly dairy science faculty observed that Dairy Challenge is the "most significant effort in dairy education in the United States."

Over the years the interest of students in the event has increased. "As soon as they find out what it is, they want to be involved with it," says Dr. Henderson. "The Western Dairy Challenge is so important to the universities in the region that just two weeks ago, 30 students from Fresno State and Cal Poly got together to practice for the contest."

The North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge was established as a management contest to incorporate all phases of a specific dairy business. It strives to incorporate a higher-learning atmosphere with practical application to help prepare students for careers in the dairy industry. Supported financially through generous donations by more than 135 agribusinesses and coordinated by a volunteer steering committee, the NAIDC has been held annually since 2002.
